Of the three disgruntled kids in **"THE BATTLE OF THE VILLA FIORITA"**, Hussey in her debut appearance is far more assured and natural than Martin Stephens (16) or Elizabeth Dear. The three form an alliance to prevent their respective parents marrying, and Hussey initiates a hunger strike. When gentler persuasion fails, her father (Rossano Brazzi) initiates a strike of his own, in the direction of Hussey's frilly knickers, spanking her at the dining table. She flounces off with a hail of latin invective, and her ally creeps up later to inspect the damage. Already at 13, Hussey radiates the sensuality for which she would later become more famous, but single-handedly she's unable to rescue a moribund, unimaginative and decidedly unsensual film.
