Those Endearing Young Charms entry:

"Deep brown eyes and brown hair. The little pig-tailed lass was the daughter of Kathleen Gilbert, radio entertainer and stage actress with the Kansas City Civic Theater. Until she was signed to a movie contract at the age of five, little Sherry worked at being a model. In her spare moments she took drama lessons from her mother, who was herself an adequate coach.

One afternoon while at a restaurant on the Sunset Strip in Hollywood, she was noticed by an ex-actor and given the address of a child agent. The agent subjected her to a screen test, which led to her winning a small role in the film "YOU'RE MY EVERYTHING".

Not only was Sherry well versed in the drama and acting field but she was also a student of singing and dancing, specifically ballet dancing. She was educated at the Melrose Avenue Grade School in Hollywood, and in her spare moments busied herself with cooking and horseback riding.

"YOU'RE MY EVERYTHING", which she performed at the age of seven, was soon followed by "A MODERN MARRIAGE", "THE BREAKING POINT", "COVERED WAGON RAIDERS", "WHERE DANGER LIVES", "THE GREAT CARUSO", "WHEN I GROW UP", "THIS WOMAN IS DANGEROUS", "THE LION AND THE HORSE", "THE MIRACLE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA", "TROUBLE ALONG THE WAY", "COME NEXT SPRING".

Miss Jackson's big year was in 1952. During that year she received the Parents Gold Medal Award as Best Child Star, the Box Office Blue Ribbon Award for her role in "MIRACLE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA", and the Milky Way Gold Star Award as one of the top juvenile performers in the nation.

It was quite a fine year for this cute moppet [sic], who was well known from coast to coast for many years as she grew up before the cameras on the Danny Thomas programme, "Make Room For Daddy"."


