33rd London Film Festival (1989) programme review of "PIROSKA E FARKAS":

"In this forest, anything is possible." Fanny lives there with her mother, a meteorologist. On the other side of the forest live her grandmother and great-grandmother. None of them ever goes to the city. In the forest a wolf talks to her and a magic tree shows her things. There's also an ornithologist whom Fanny thinks might be her father.

This updated version of the Red Riding Hood story, latest in the **Tales For All** series, is stylised, hypnotic and mysterious. In this respect it marks a break from the traditions of simplicity established by the other Tales, but the audience at Cannes Junior in May this year had no difficulty in responding to it. A point of incidental interest is that it marks the first time a child actor has ever appeared in more than one Tale - Fanny Lauzier was previously seen as Daphne in "**TADPOLE AND THE WHALE**". "
