Film Review 1991-92 review:

"1958, France. What looks like it's going to be an idyllic summer holiday on the beach is transformed into a period of mixed emotions for Frédérique, 13, and her little sister, Sophie, 6. At the very last moment their mother, Lena (Nathalie Baye), stays behind in Lyon, while the children journey on to the coastal resort of La Baule-les pins with their bossy governess. There they miss Lena but get on with the joys of childhood mischief, swimming and witnessing the high jinks of their uncle, Léon (Jean-Pierre

Bacri). As Frédérique begins to fall in love with her cousin, Daniel, she gradually becomes aware of the friction in her own parents' marriage. "C'EST LA VIE" is just that - a big slice of life, complete with all its traumas, joys and discoveries. It is also a very rich, multi-layered film, superbly acted by an ensemble cast and beautifully lit by Giuseppe Lanci. This is the fourth chapter in Diane Kurys's autobiographical omnibus (following on from "PEPPERMINT SODA", "COCKTAIL MOLOTOV" and "COUP DE FOUDRE"):
